Put on your work gloves and dig in - spring cleaning goes into overdrive in Kingman County the week of April 18.

Household hazardous waste collection April 18

Kingman County will join with the Kingman County Conservation District and the City of Kingman to hold a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Monday, April 18. Residents are encouraged to bring waste items “too toxic to trash” to the Kingman County Activity Center, 121 S. Main in Kingman, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Items accepted: adhesives, glues & epoxy; aerosols; arts & craft chemicals; automotive products; fluorescent lights; household cleaners; lawn & garden chemicals; mercury thermometers; oil based paints (no latex); paint chemicals; pesticides & herbicides; photo chemicals, pool chemicals.

Everything must be in marked containers. No unmarked containers will be accepted. This event is not for commercial or business disposal – it is for residential disposal only.

John Wimer, County Noxious Weed Director, reminds residents that household hazardous waste items also may be taken to the Noxious Weed office at 900 E. A Ave. on weekdays. Please call 620-532-5187 for hours.

Extended hours for Recycle Center April 18-22

The Kingman County Recycle Center will be open extended hours from April 18 to April 22 to coincide with the City of Kingman spring clean-up and Earth Day.

The center, located at 337 N. Marquette St., will be open as follows: 1 to 8 p.m. on April 18, 20 and 22; 7:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. on April 19; and 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. on April 21. To use the drive-thru, enter from Marquette Street and exit onto East C Avenue. For a complete list of recyclable items, visit the county’s website at kingmancoks.org (select “Government,” then “Recycle Center”).

E-waste will be accepted April 18-22 at no cost. Examples include: computers (CPU, laptops, keyboard, monitors, mouse, printers, fax machines, scanners); audio equipment (stereo, speakers); cameras (digital, video, film); cell phones (including two-way); copiers (including toner cartridges); gaming systems (Game Boy, Nintendo, Play Station); media players (CD, DVD, VCR, MP3, iPod);

microwave ovens, televisions. The usual fee for CRT computer monitors and tube type televisions is waived for this week only.
