'Take-back' event yields pounds of drugs

Kingman County Sheriff Randy Hill reports that 52 pounds of unwanted or expired prescription drugs were collected in the county April 30 as part of a drug “take-back” event. The drugs were collected in a four-hour period at the Law Enforcement Center, 125 N. Spruce in Kingman.

This was the 11th drug “take-back” event, which is free and anonymous. The nationwide effort has been held periodically since 2010 and is administered by the Drug Enforcement Association. Its purpose is to allow for safe disposal of unwanted drugs.

The April 30 event collected a total of 13,894 pounds of drugs in Kansas. More than 90,000 pounds of drugs have been collected in the state since September 2010.
