Election canvass adds votes, doesn't change outcomes

A canvass Monday morning of the 2016 General Election did not change any outcomes in Kingman County.

A total of 61 provisional ballots were considered by the Kingman County Commission, with 31 being approved to be counted. Many ballots were rejected for voter registration problems, most commonly with either the voter not being registered at all or being registered to vote in another county.

County Clerk Carol Noblit, who also is the county's Election Officer, said a total of 3,419 voters cast ballots. That's a voter turnout of 66 percent.

There were no contested races for county offices, with incumbents re-elected in every office but one. The lone newcomer is Jerome (Jerry) Henning, who is the new Kingman County Commissioner for District 2. He was elected to a four-year term.

Voters in Cunningham USD 332 approved a change in how their Board of Education members are elected, from being elected in districts to all being elected at-large.
